And how will we do it? It will be a training course, but not one where you sit back and relax. We will use active methods based on experiential learning in combination with practical theory. It means that we will be using discussions, simulations, role plays etc and you will exchange the experiences you have from your day to day work with other participants and work together on concrete future project plans. A strong principle of the Sailor's courses is the belief that "learning from each other" is fundamental to nonformal learning.

## OUR AIM AND OBJECTIVES

#### Aim:

Sailors on the Citizenship - Discovering Africa is a training course that aims to promote active participation, through training of youth leaders, youth workers and educators from Africa and from Europe. This project aims to create a pool of multipliers and common tools among the partners involved which aware local young people about the importance of the active participation with attention at strengthening Euro-African dialogue and importance of exchange and cooperation in the field of youth.

## **BEFORE**

### All you need to know about preparation for the content:

Every participant/or group of participants from one country should prepare a:

- A short presentation about **youth** in his/her country (global picture of youth in the specific country)
- A short presentation how is **youth participation** supported in your country? (youth policies, youth councils, other bodies and organizations)
- Key information on **youth work** and **youth information system** in your country
- A description of one example of good **practice of youth initiatives** implemented at the **local level** (best will be examples that you know from your own experience)

### Preparation for intercultural evening

Bring with you a short story or any creative interactive presentation of your **culture** for the intercultural evening (you will present your own cultures - national, regional, personal or any kind of culture to which you feel you belong. A culture may be presented by a song, a story, a poem, a dance, try to make it as interactive as possible). If you want you can as well bring food or a drink. The idea is to "taste" our cultures and it is up to you how you present it to others.

#### Preparation organisation market

Bring with you key information about organisation you represent, sharing this information will be basis for future cooperation and for getting to know our realities.

Please, keep in mind that due to the number of countries we will not be able to have long presentations on all the topics mentioned above, that is why while preparing for the content focus on **key information** on each topic and (if possible) **visualisation**: eg. photos, brochures.

## **DURING**

### What you can expect to experience and learn in key words:

Theory and training of **youth participation in public life** though workshops, practice of this participation through study visit in local youth organizations in Tanzania, understanding realities of youth work and youth information systems in 4 European and 4 African countries through presentations and exchange of good practice and going through an unique intercultural experience.

# **PRACTICALITIES**

# **COSTS**

**Board, lodging and programme costs** will be provided and paid by grants from the YOUTH IN ACTION Programme.

**Insurance** will not be covered from Programme costs. This means that you are obliged to take care of insurance on your own. You have to **bring your insurance invoice** as it will be take as a proof and further as a co-finance measure.

## REFUND OF TRAVEL EXPENSES

The **travel reimbursement** rule will be done following the agreement taking with your sending organisation.

Please note that any reimbursement of your travel expenditure will only be possible upon presentation of documentary evidence of the sum actually paid (invoice, copy of credit card slip, etc). This evidence of expenditure will be attached to the claim form for reimbursement together with the relevant travel tickets or a copy (plane, train, etc). Please note that without proof of the amount paid the European Commission cannot effectuate a reimbursement. This rule applies also to electronic tickets.

The reimbursement will be done by **bank transfer** for a single bank account of the sending country agreed among the participants and the partner organisation. The correct bank details should be provided by the sending country. If there's any mistake on that information which leads for an extra bank taxes, this amount will be deducted on the amount transferred.

The reimbursement will occur only after received all relevant document mentioned before.

## **VISA**

Most of you will need to issue the visa at **Dar Es Salaam Airport**, in Tanzania, upon your arrival. Please bring your ticket and this guide printed with you, where it contains the hosting address. You may also need cash to pay for it (according to local sources it costs around **50 US dollars** for a European citizen).

Kenyans and Ugandans do not need Visa. South Africans will apply for VISA in their own country.

# WEATHER, HEALTH AND OTHER PRACTICAL INFORMATION

### Weather

The average temperature at this time of year is around 25 degrees Celsius. You can check the weather on

### Health

Vaccinations are required for entry into Tanzania, an International certificate of vaccination against Yellow Fever is required for travellers and it suggested hepatitis A and Typhoid fever. Malaria medicine should be brought as well.

If for health reasons you take any specific medicine please bring sufficient supply for the duration of your stay as it might not be possible to find them on location.

The venue has mosquito nets in the windows.

### Sunscream

Please also bring sun protector and after sun cream as some of the activities will be outside. It's also recommended repellent.

### Clothing

Please foresee light clothing as temperatures are mild. Bring comfortable clothes and also your bathing clothes! A raining coat might be necessary as well.

#### Electric Power

Electric Power is 230V running at 50Hz. The Plug types used are:

### Mobile phones

You will find various mobile networks available with the possibility of using roaming or buying a local SIM card using directly a local network.

### Time

Time in Tanzania is three hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+3).

### Languages

Swahili and English are the official languages of Tanzania. However, the great majority speaks Swahili in their daily life and only the most educated ones are fluently in English.

### • During the Programme

The trips organised in the framework of the programme are foreseen with specific means of transport but if participants want to go into town the transport is at their own costs.

### Internet access

You should be aware that we cannot guaranty internet access during your stay at Tanzania. You might want to do the necessary arrangements in order to be a week without internet access.

### Money and Means of Payment

NB: It is advisable to exchange your money in a bank at the airport, this will avoid problems with fake bills and security risks.
